
Scary Stories for Young Foxes by Christian McKay Heidicker - Short Stories; **2020 Newbery Honor Book**

Unplugged by Gordon Korman - Humorous/Adventure Fiction; **Great Stone Face** Nominee 2021-2022




Jett is determined to get to the bottom of things, but can he convince everybody that he is no longer just a spoiled brat who is making trouble?


I Survived the Nazi Invasion, 1944
