

Climate Action Plan & GHG Reduction Targets



Baseline greenhouse gas emissions inventory completed in 2001 for 1995 baseline year

Plan adopted 2004; set goal to reduce local government emissions by 20% and community emissions by 10% by 2015

Result: Municipal emissions reduced by 25% (not including the landfill); Community emissions reduced by ~ 3%

SOLID WASTE



Energy and Climate Committee Purpose



- Sec. 2-1088 of City Code
- In order to protect Keene's public health, safety and welfare, as well as the economic vitality of the community, the energy and climate committee exists to:
 - Monitor and advocate for the reduction of greenhouse gas emissions,
 - Promote energy conservation and efficiency, as well as the use and production of renewable energy, and
 - Increase awareness of and resilience to the expected impacts of a changing climate.



ECC Role/Functions

- Sec. 2-1092 of City Code
 - Update Climate Action Plan (CAP)
 - Coordinate goals & measures of CAP
 - Advise City Council
 - Promote successes, awards, recognitions
 - Outreach and education
 - Apply for grants / pursue other funding
- Receive gifts/donations
- Other (as required by City Council or requested by the City Manager)

Recent Work – Energy Plan Work Groups

- Home Energy Labeling
 - Research into model
 - Participation in NEEP cohort
- Weatherization / Energy Efficiency
 - Annual Keene Energy week
 - Partnership with CET NHSaves Button Up workshops
