1.	Will this project address vehicles parking over the edge of the sidewalk in front of the U-Haul property?
2.	Will this project fix the Adams St. sewer?
3.	I live at the end of Prescott St and have major drainage issues. There is no drain at the end of the street. This problem seems to be affecting the entire street, which causes the pavement to fall apart along the sides. There is often large amounts of water pooling. I know this isn't part of the Marlboro Street Project but was advised to write my concern.
4.	We are interested in looking at the curb cut in front of our building, and possibly moving it to the other side of our parking lot entrance.
5.	We do not live in NY City. Why do we need more green space at the expense of parking? The city planning process already requires site plans to provide green space. Adding green space to the road edge is redundant.
6.	I think we should put water garden in front of EVERY City Coucilors house and see who takes care of them.
7.	I own a business on Marlboro St. and really appreciate getting a call asking if I needed to maintain the curb cut between my property and Marlboro St. Yes I do! So glad to be asked.
8.	There should be parking on the north side of street as well as south side where existing businesses are in place. For example, the area from the Savings Bank of Walpole towards rotary up to the post office entry. The City should maintain existing parking on south side from Adams Street to Fletcher Funeral Home. Parking is at a premium as-is without eliminating more available parking potential.
9.	What is the cost? How many linear feet from one end to the other?
10.	I think it's important to incorporate as much green infrastructure (GI) as possible. As a gateway intot the city, Marlboro St. needs to model what is possible as far as GI. Also, make the sidewalks as shaded + park-like as possible. Multiple shade trees have tremendous benefit aesthetically + functionally.
11.	Marlboro St. has an abundance of electrical transformers. These are VERY UGLY. Is there a plan to simplify or modernize the electrical grid? How about more trees?
