Roadway Safety Plan Committee (RSPC)

Action Plan – Goal Setting

Requirements: BOTH of the following need to be true.

1. A high-ranking official and/or governing body in the jurisdiction publicly committed to an eventual goal of zero roadway fatalities and serious injuries; and
2. The commitment includes either setting a target date to reach zero OR setting one or more targets to achieve significant declines in roadway fatalities and serious injuries by a specific date.

Goal Examples:

- New Hampshire 2022-2026 SHSP Goal
“Reduce the number of fatalities and serious injuries by 50% by 2035, working toward 0 by 2050.”
- Boston Vision Zero Goal
“Eliminate fatal and serious traffic crashes in the city by 2030.”
- Greater Portland (Maine) Vision Zero
“Eliminate fatalities and serious injuries by 2045.”
- Saint Paul, Minnesota Transportation Safety Action Plan (2023)
“Zero fatalities and serious injuries by 2045, 50 percent reduction within ten years.”
