During the pandemic, Dr. Len Fleischer was part of an international group that focused virtually on “The Legacy of the Holocaust for Germans and Jews, Israelis and Palestinians.” The child of Holocaust survivors, he joined other children and grandchildren of survivors and perpetrators in focusing on trans-generational and collective trauma on a journey to the death camp at Auschwitz. In this place of the utmost inhumanity, he found a depth of human connection and vision that have broad implications for the integration and transformation of individual and collective trauma.
