

**EXTENDED POLICE AUTHORITY AGREEMENT
AMONG THE MUNICIPAL POLICE DEPARTMENTS
OF CHESHIRE COUNTY, NEW HAMPSHIRE**

WHEREAS, The Chief Law Enforcement Officers of the municipalities of Cheshire County have agreed that effective law enforcement would be promoted if each municipal law enforcement agency in the County extends law enforcement authority to all other municipal law enforcement agencies in Cheshire County:

WHEREAS, RSA 105:13 and RSA 48:11-a authorize the Chief Law Enforcement Officer to execute written agreements extending such law enforcement authority to each other for purposes of mutual aid:

THEREFORE, The Chief Law Enforcement Officers of the municipalities signed below hereby agree to provide such mutual aid as follows:

1. Authority Extended

The law enforcement authority of a duly authorized police officer of any town or city that is a signatory to this agreement shall be extended to any other town or city that is a signatory of this agreement, subject to the terms and conditions provided herein.

2. Request for Assistance

The extended law enforcement authority granted under this agreement shall only be exercised under the following conditions:

- (a) When any police officer or dispatcher of any police department specifically requests assistance from any other department(s).
- (b) When a police officer in any town or city that is a signatory to this agreement has reason to believe that the health or safety of a police officer in another town or city that is a signatory to this agreement may be in jeopardy.
- (c) When a member town or city offers paid details to the police officers in any other town or city that has signed this agreement.

- (d) When a police officer in one member town or city, is in a town or city that is also a member of this agreement and is on duty, in uniform and in a conspicuously marked police car and observes a motor vehicle or criminal offense occur in his/her presence.

3. Direction, Powers and Duties of Responding Officers

Officers responding to a request for assistance shall accept direction from the senior on-duty officer of the requesting town or city that is at the scene. Radio communications shall be organized by the town or city receiving assistance using the state-wide interoperability radio system. Responding officers shall possess the same power and have the same duties, rights, privileges and immunities in the requesting town or city as they would in their own community. All summonses and arrests shall be prosecuted by the community in which the offense occurred.

4. Legal Status and Responsibility of Responding Officers

Officers from any town or city that is a member to this agreement, when providing assistance to any other town or city, shall be considered employees of the town or city they are routinely employed by for purposes of worker's compensation, police professional liability insurance, and motor vehicle insurance.

Each town or city shall be solely responsible for any negligent acts of its own police officers whether those acts occur within its own jurisdiction or within the jurisdiction of the requesting town or city. Each municipality specifically agrees to hold the other harmless from any lawsuits or other actions brought as a result of the negligence of its officers.

5. Damage to Equipment

The requesting city or town shall be responsible from all damage to the responding municipalities' equipment not covered by insurance that is a result of rendering aid to the requesting municipality. The requesting municipality shall not be responsible for any damage caused by the negligence of the responding municipalities' employees.

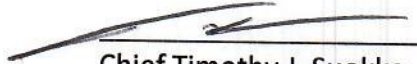
6. Agreement in Force Until Terminated

This agreement shall remain in full force and effect among all signatory municipalities until ten (10) days after the Chief Law Enforcement Officer of any town or city notifies the other member Chief Law Enforcement Officers of that community's intent to withdraw from this agreement. In addition, this agreement shall remain intact between the communities remaining. Lastly, this agreement shall be binding on successor Chief Law Enforcement Officers unless a Chief Law Enforcement Officer withdraws from this agreement as set forth above.

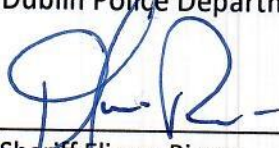
